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Grammar Learning Study



Purpose

To study how much input children need to learn a made-up grammatical form (e.g., the boat sail-o, the girl jump-o.) This could tell us about how to provide better treatment for kids who have trouble with grammar and sentence structure.

Children receive up to \$80 for participation.

Caregivers may receive a summary of all testing for their child, whether or not their child qualifies to participate.



Who Qualifies?

4-9 year old English-speaking children with typically developing language skills and don't have autism, a hearing impairment, or mental retardation.

Caregiver Responsibilities

Bring your child to a local site (school, daycare, community center) for 1 preliminary visit to evaluate your child's communication skills.

Allow your child to attend 1-3 more visits, spaced 3-7 days apart, at an agreed upon location near you. Most children need a total of 3 appointments to complete the study.

You do not have to travel to the University of Iowa. We will travel to you.
